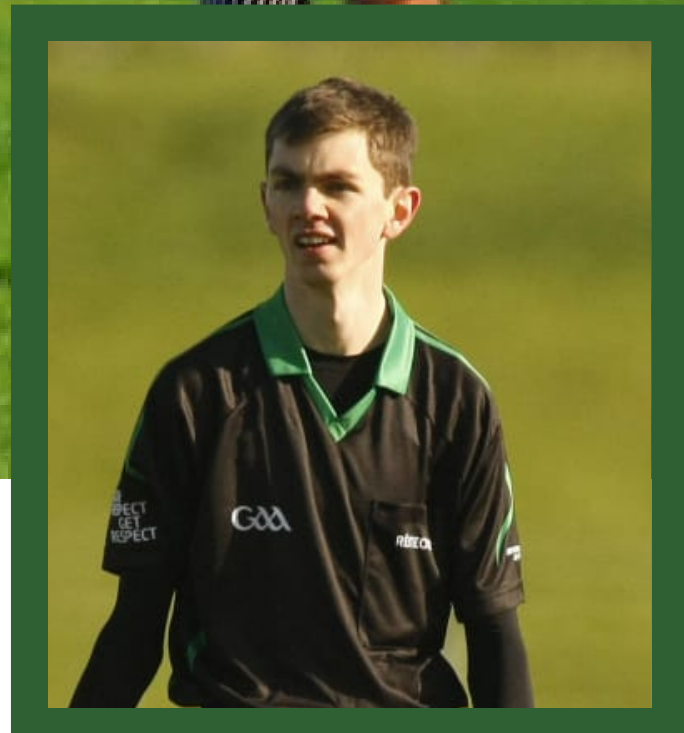

DIVISION 1: DELANEY CUP

THE Delaney Cup was presented to Meath County Board in September 1956 by Eamon Delaney from Laytown who was a well-known figure in horse-racing circles. It is one of the finest trophies in Meath's collection and was presented specifically for Minor football. Navan De La Salle were the first winners of the cup...they beat Kilskyre in the 1956 final, 3-5 to 1-8. Michael O'Brien was the first winning captain. The quality of the finalists was highlighted a year later when nine of the participants were on the Meath panel that won the county's first All-Ireland Minor title.

The players in the starting team were Brendan Cahill (capt), Jack Fagan and Seamus Clynch of De La Salle and Toss Gibney and Jimmy Halpin of Kilskyre.

DIVISION 2: LIAM TOLAN CUP

The Liam Tolan Cup honours one of Meath's brightest young prospects who lost his life in a road accident in 2010. Earlier that day he had played at corner-forward for the county minors in their Leinster Championship clash with Offaly at Pairc Tailteann. He was just 17 years of age. Liam's football career started at Rathfeigh NS where he showed exceptional promise and he later, he was a key figure

as Ashbourne Community School's successes in 2008 and 2009. He also starred for the Meath Vocational Schools team when they won Leinster honours in 2009 and 2010. He was the outstanding player on the Skryne Under-16 team that won the Division 1 title in 2007.

DIVISION 2: NOEL CURRAN CUP

The Noel Curran Cup honours one of Meath's all-time greats who was full-forward on the All-Ireland winning team of 1967. Noel's performance in the '66 All-Ireland semi against Down was exceptional and his display against Louth in the Leinster Championship in '67 was also memorable. He was a member of the team that made the historic trip to Australia in 1968 where he played a major role in Meath's hugely successful venture.

He was a particularly loyal servant of the Dunshaughlin club and starred in their Junior and Intermediate Championship successes in 1967 and 1977 respectively.

DIVISION 4: DAIRE MAXWELL CUP

The Daire Maxwell Cup honours a promising Skryne player who lost his life in a road accident in 2007. Daire's football career began in Rathfeigh NS but it was in Lismullen NS where his talents and leadership skills came to the fore. He was captain of the team that won the Division 3 Cumann na mBunscoil title in 2003 and had moved up through the Under-age ranks with Skryne to play on the Minor teams that were runners-up in the 2006 Championship and League. He had played at corner back against St Martins only days before the fatal accident.

DIVISION 5: CHRISTY REYNOLDS CUP

The Christy Reynolds Cup honours a great servant of the Walterstown club. Christy was a native of Termonfeckin in Co Louth and played with the local St Fechins club. His subsequent move to Walterstown was a real blessing for Meath football as his eldest son Pat

went on to become one of the Royal County's most successful footballers winning an All-Ireland SFC in 1967 and a NFL medal in 1975. Pat became the county's first All-Star in 1971

and played a key role in Walterstown's rise from the Junior ranks to become kingpins of Meath and Leinster. Christy's other sons Christy Jnr, Gerry, Ray and Paul also excelled for Walterstown.

May 5, 2020 was to be the first round of the Leinster MFC but instead of taking to the pitch the Meath minor team were hitting the roads taking part in a 150km challenge in aid of Stewarts Care.

All GAA activity was suspended on the March 12 and zoom meetings, tik-tok videos, cooking challenges and wearing out wheelie bins kicking footballs replaced Tuesday nights in Dunganny. Each Monday started with an online group work out & a chance to check in with everyone. Two strained backs & a torn hamstring for coaches reduced their role to that of observers!

This squad deserve huge credit for their efforts, mindset & positive attitude through this period.

With a maturity beyond their years they kept themselves busy and active. We returned training in Dunganny on the 15th September and it was great to see everyone in good health, great spirits and moving well.

Club activity restarting in July was a huge boost, lads have had the opportunity to play plenty of football in really good weather conditions and perfect pitches.

Credit to Minor Board and the Fixtures Committee in Meath for the schedule they put together culminating in the finals today.

Being at a loose end the management team went on a road trip through July and August lending a new voice or helping out with club minor training sessions.

The welcome received and seeing first-hand the efforts of players and coaches alike in all the 14 clubs visited across the county was the highlight of this time.

It emphasised the need and opportunity for club and county to work together for the enjoyment and improvement of the players, which ultimately benefits both.

The 17th October is the new date for the first round of the Leinster Minor Football

Championship. With restrictions in place the crowd may not be what we would wish for but players will know that the county stands with them as step out in Pairc Tailteann and start their minor campaign in what has been the strangest of years.

OUR instructions were clear
before every contest, Some may
have objected, but we
understood.

"Just give him the ball," he'd do
the rest

Don't believe me? Fair enough,
but if you'd seen him you would
Those unaware would take him
for granted,

"That chap's tiny. He's out of his
depth!"

Their opinion would change
when the first goal was planted,
But the avalanche that followed
meant they'd never forget.

From the left or the right, close
to goal or from far,

Showing the finest defenders a
clean set of heels..

In the back of the net or popped
over the bar,

There were few other outcomes
when he got the O'Neills.

The elders took notice as he
matured like a wine,

Those men on high stools
talked for hours of his rise.

"Don't rush him!" they said. "He
has plenty of time,"

A future club star in everyone's
eyes.

Soon his stock grew and the

lived up to it all.



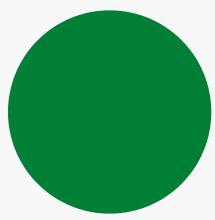
