
It gives me great

AN FEAR UASAL

Last February a cloud of great sadness fell over Donaghmore Ashbourne GAA community when the news of the death of a true gentleman and great club member Dónal Ó Loingsigh began to filter around the village. Poor Dónal passed away after a short and brave battle with illness leaving behind his wife Síle, daughter Doireann, son Fiach, son in law Dónal, daughter in law Fi and grandchildren Eleanor, Hugh, Siun and Darrach together with his extended family anda large community of friends.

Originally from Baile Bhuirne in the West Cork Gealtacht, Dónal was a proud Cork man and always flew the Rebel's flag. He followed the 'Blood and Bandage' of both the footballers and hurlers on every possible occasion with pride and passion. Outside his family Dónal had a huge love for the small ball and was an ever-present driving force for hurling in Donaghmore Ashbourne since his arrival in Ashbourne. He was a consistent promoter of the game from Acorn level right up to adult level and even when things were not going so well within the code Dónal's drive and persistence ensured that we got through the tough times by ensuring that lads kept playing and hurling continued. Dónal made it work with his drive and passion and ability to get people on board and not take the easy option and give up.

He was very well respected with the wider GAA Hurling community in Meath and this was very much evident with the tributes that were posted on social media at the time of this death.

His other love was that of the Irish Language and Dónal had the most beautiful way of promoting the language whenever he could. He had a great ability to make people conformable with whatever level of Irish one had. If you wanted to have a full conversation or only had a cúpla focal, he treated you with respect and appreciated that you're trying to use what you had. His warm character never made people feel conscious about that they did not know as he encouraged them to use what they did. Outside his role with the hurlers, Dónal always gave as much as he could to the club. He was a member of the stewards committee, grounds committee, Executive member and was a driving force for the GAA's cultural arm, the Scór competition. A quiet and pleasant man, who always met you with a smile and the open hand of friendship. He was quiet spoken and never raised his voice or showed aggression. But he was no push over and was well able to stand up for his beliefs and could make his point at meetings eloquently without any aggression or intimidation. He had a great ability to get his point across in a quiet way and he could bring people along and get things done. Such was his warmth it was hard to refuse Dónal on the rare occasion he did ask for help. He was an extremely dedicated and

respected primary school teacher and was a founding member of the teaching staff of Scoil an tSeachtar Laoch in Ballymun. He was one of the four original teachers when they first opened in 1973 and later became principle during his career there. In fact, Síle also served on the teaching staff there and now Doireann continues their teaching legacy in the school. Again the tributes that were posted by the Ballymun community showed the love and respect they had for this true gentleman.

Those of us who were lucky enough to have Dónal enter our lives are the richer for our experience.






